Beatitudes

Reflection: Sunday 16 February 2025: Luke 6: 17,20 - 26

Today, from Luke, we get the short version of the Beatitudes: four blessings, four maledictions. Jesus is making it very clear that God's favour, his blessing, falls on those whose lives are poor and hard. He himself is one of the poor and he is challenging the idea, prevalent in Judaic culture, that riches in life were a sign of God's blessing. That a good life is to be had in the here and now. Jesus knows what the life of the poor is like. The hardships they endure, especially in living the life of Christ, will be more than compensated for in the life to come. He is raising our perspective, above the flat land he is preaching on, to the high reaches of God's kingdom. A good name there is not earned by empty



praise on earth. We are warmly encouraged to persevere in living the life of God's truth through all hardships.

JUBILEE HOLY YEAR 2025

Expressions of Hope: The jubilee year with its theme: "Pilgrims of Hope", calls Christians to action. Pope Francis called for "signs of hope" in the Jubilee Year, including the desire for peace in the world, openness to life and responsible parenthood, and closeness to prisoners, the poor, the sick, the young, the elderly, migrants and people "in difficult situations." Pope Francis has called on affluent counties to forgive the debts of countries that would never be able to repay them, and address "ecological debt," which he described as "connected to commercial imbalances with effects on the environment and the disproportionate use of natural resources by certain countries over long periods of time."

Let us think: Hope can be nurtured within our families and shared with others. A simple smile can ignite hope in someone who feels lonely, while kind words like 'please,' 'sorry,' and 'thank you' are powerful gestures that can be practiced anytime, anywhere, to spread hope and kindness.

Jubilee Indulgence: Drawing on their Jewish roots, jubilee years emphasize the sacrament of reconciliation and restoring relationships with God. They also provide an opportunity for a special jubilee indulgence, which can remove the residual effects of sin through the grace of Christ.

Let us think: No indulgence is automatically granted; it requires the sacraments of confession and Holy Communion, along with fulfilling the specific conditions of the indulgence. <u>The</u> <u>Catholic Parish of Otari offers opportunity for Sacrament of Confession and personal</u> <u>prayer before the Blessed Sacrament on every Friday from 6pm to 7pm throughout the</u> <u>jubilee year.</u> With a pure heart, we can receive a plenary indulgence daily, even outside a Jubilee year, through acts such as praying the Rosary, making the Stations of the Cross, or devoutly reading Scripture for at least 30 minutes.

Pilgrimage: In this jubilee year, they are expecting an influx of pilgrims in the Eternal City. Italy's National Tourist Research Institute projects 35 million visitors in 2025, nearly triple of its 13 million visitors in 2023. Pilgrimage is a "fundamental" part of jubilee events, Pope Francis said in "*Spes Non Confundit*." "Setting out on a journey is traditionally associated with our human quest for meaning in life. A pilgrimage on foot is a great aid for rediscovering the value of silence, effort and simplicity of life," he wrote. He noted that jubilee pilgrims are likely to visit Rome's Christian catacombs and its seven pilgrim churches — the basilicas of St. Peter, St. Mary Major, St. John Lateran, St. Paul Outside the Walls, St. Lawrence, Holy Cross and St. Sebastian — destinations St. Philip Neri popularized in the 16th century with a 15-mile walk. Twelve other Roman churches, including the Sanctuary of Divine Love in southeast Rome, are designated "jubilee churches" intended as gathering spots for pilgrims during the jubilee.

Let us think: Most of us may not have the opportunity to make a pilgrimage to Rome, but a pilgrimage doesn't always mean traveling to faraway places. Our pilgrimage can be as simple as visiting our parish church and spending some time before the Blessed Sacrament or visiting neighbourhood churches like the Sacred Heart Cathedral or St. Mary of Angels in the town. The Catholic Parish of Otari will be undertaking a Marian Pilgrimage to Our Lady of Kapiti on Saturday, 18th of October 2025. Hope most of us can make it as part of our pil-grimage in this jubilee year!
