There is a Season...

Last Sunday we began a new church year, beginning with the Season of Advent. We are now in Year B, and the Gospel of Mark.

Mark's Gospel is often under-rated, compared with Matthew and Luke. It is considerbly shorter than the others, and was even seen at one time as a abridged version of Matthew!



Nothing could be further than the truth. Mark is written earlier than Matthew and Luke and it shows! Mark mentions details that are eye witness accounts in a way that Matthew and Luke simply cannot. It is also true that both Matthew and Luke have access to Mark's Gospel, and make good use of it. Their own accounts would be severly depleted if it were not for Mark's influence on their own writings. Enjoy Mark this year. It is a beautiful gospel.

We are also in the Season of Advent – only 22 days this year. Advent is when we prepare for the great Feast of Christmas. It is an inner journey. There are many ways we can prepare. Even if you cannot get to daily Mass, you can always download the Mass readings and just reflect on them. I try to spend time by myself and be with the Lord. I think of Mary and what she must have been thinking as she carried Jesus in her womb, waiting for the time for him to be born. Can we not prepare ourselves in the same way!

This particular year is also a time for goodbyes and welcomes in our parish. Three of the four of us are leaving! Only Fr Tikoua is staying! I am going to Holy Cross Seminary as senior-priest-in-residence, Deacon Matt is going to the Catholic Parish of the Wairarapa as Assistant Deacon, and Pre-seminarian Quang Dong is going to Ohariu Parish.

We welcome Fr Joy Thottankara as Parish Priest. He is presently Assistant Priest at the Cathedral and is already part of our Pastoral Area. He will be a real gift to the parish. We also welcome pre–Seminarian Long Tran. Welcome to you both. The actual shifts will take place on 1 February 2024. **God bless, Father Ron**


