## 27th April 2025 2nd Sunday of Easter

Year C

### Reflection: Sunday 27 April 2025: John 20: 19-31

The closing chapters of John's Gospel are devoted to the appearances of the risen Jesus, first to Mary of Magdala and then to the Disciples. The small community had been sheltering behind locked doors--fearful, confused and deeply grieving—after the desolation of the Cross and the burial of the Master. And Jesus enters. He bestows his peace on them. He shows them his wounds. He breathes on them the power of the Holy Spirit. He commissions them. He gives them authority over sin: to forgive and to retain.



The Disciples react with simple, pure joy when they see the risen Lord. Our own celebration of Easter this year was overshadowed by the news of last Monday evening, that our beloved Pope Francis had died. This was a grief amid the joy of Easter, a wound to our spirits.

But as the news deepened and matured, I think we all felt just how fitting it was that Papa Francis had been called home just after Easter, to experience the Risen Lord at first hand in the kingdom of Heaven after his heroic struggles during a long life as priest, bishop, and pope.

The Catholic theologian Hans Urs von Balthasar wrote, stressing the ultimate individuality of spiritual experience: *"Nothing has every borne fruit in the Church without emerging from the darkness of a long period of loneliness into the light of the community."* 

I think here of the Passion of Jesus, particularly that deep pit of grief, loneliness and desolation he felt in the Garden and carried to the Cross. I also think of that time in the life of Jorge Bergoglio when he was exiled to Córdoba in the winter of 1990 and forbidden all ministry except the sacrament of penance. Those hard, lonely years saw the beginning of deep personal changes in the man who would step out again into the light of the Catholic community as Pope Francis. He served us brothers and sisters full of the Easter joy and peace.
